

## CAN YOU RECOGNIZE THE ACCENTS?

<b>ACCENT</b>	<b>SPECIFICITIES</b>	<b>EXTRACT NUMBER</b> ...
<b>Southern accent (US)</b>	Very nasal and slow – <i>glide</i> the vowels! It's not a cow, it's a <b>caayow</b> '	
<b>South African accent</b>	You don't keep pets, but <b>pits</b> !	
<b>Californian accent (US)</b>	The intonation often rises and the voice cracks ( <i>vocal fry</i> )... because you have to sound cool!	
<b>Liverpool 'Scouse' accent (UK)</b>	It's all about the 'K'... very strange indeed!	
<b>Midwestern accent (US)</b> e.g. Michigan	It's all about the sound / <b>æ</b> / It's not that <b>biad</b> of an <b>iaccent</b> !	
<b>Irish accent</b>	Almost Scottish but don't <i>roll</i> the Rs	
<b>Cockney accent (UK)</b>	<i>Drop</i> a lot of letters and become a tough Londoner!	
<b>Indian accent</b>	It's funny in every situation!	
<b>Scottish accent (UK)</b>	<i>Roll</i> your Rs + / <b>ɑʊ</b> / becomes / <b>əu</b> / and most of the diphthongs sound different!	
<b>Australian accent</b>	Almost British... but not really! Now that's a tricky one	
<b>French accent</b>	No help needed! Some say it's charming	
<b>Received pronunciation BBC (UK)</b>	Be posh and speak like the Queen. It's just like playing in Downtown Abbey!	
<b>NY accent (US)</b>	Have some attitude! Don't ask for a cup of coffee, but a cup of <b>cwaffee</b> .
